


PDPU

One of the world class University partners in the country, PDPU has always provided support to AIESEC Ahmedabad in numerous ways, a few of which includes co-creating projects and hosting multiple international participants every year. And Project NAMASTE 4.0 is the 9th project in line.



NAMASTE 4.0

Project NAMASTE 4.0 is the 9th project hosted by PDPU & AIESEC in Ahmedabad. AIESEC Incoming Projects in PDPU are hosted with an aim to increase Internationalization on campus, develop leadership skills amongst its students, promote real life learning experiences, disband multi-cultural stereotypes and develop different world perspectives.

Project NAMASTE 4.0 is all about 25 Internationals from 5+ countries interning at PDPU from 15th July, 2016 to 31st August, 2016. NAMASTE 4.0 revolves around the idea of letting the interns experience the University life in India alongside creating an impact on the society. The project supports the following 4 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) from the 17 SDGs proposed by United Nations in September 2015:

- 1. Quality Education
- 2. No Poverty
- 3. Clean & Affordable Energy
- 4. Good Health & Well Being

The major objective of the project was to conduct case studies on above goals by analyzing the ground realities and then suggesting solutions for problems faced by the society at this juncture. Along with this it also focused on providing interns a life changing experience by getting them out of their comfort zones, giving them space to interact with University and local crowd thereby ensuring a fair deal of cultural exchange and personal development. One of the job description of interns was to work with the University clubs and learn an art of their choice ie. Music , Drama or Dance.

UNIVERSITY CLUBS

Project NAMASTE 4.0 collaborated with the following clubs of the University to ensure maximum student-intern interaction throughout the course of the project :

RANG

Rang is the fine arts club of PDPU. It aims to inspire young minds to have creative and artistic view and provide a strong base to showcase their talents, to make the students familiar to most types of Artistic methods used to make greeting cards, paint T-shirts and make Recycled Goods and to conduct workshops and Exhibitions and help students to have monetary gain from the same.

2. OFFBEAT

It is the Music Club of PDPU. If you have the thriving for Music, if the beats pump up blood through your veins then Offbeat's the place for you. The club focuses on various kinds of instrument and music genre learning.

3. SOUL PEPPER

It is said to the most active club of PDPU as it is a home to all the Dance & Drama lovers in the University. The Club not only supports various art forms like Mime, Bhangda, Bollywood, Classical etc but also develops the theatre skills amongst its members. They participate in various intra and inter level state competitions and make PDPU proud.

4. ENVIROCRATS

With the vision of educating young leaders in global citizenship. The purpose of this club is to champion a new model of building perspectives that connects the timeless lessons from nature to a relevant and effective preparation for a fast-changing future.

5. SPORTS COMMITTEE

Sports Committee of PDPU is a result of extreme passion shown by the students towards indoor and outdoor sports activities in the university ranging from Football, Basketball, Cricket to Chess, Tennis etc.

6. JHAROKHA

It is the literary club of PDPU meant for all all the literature freaks who want to delve deeper into the world of words, literature and classics. This Club aims to bring together people who share the same interests towards reading, writing, poetry etc.



PRE -PROJECT PHASE

'Through the organization of Incoming Projects, AIESEC & PDPU provide young students with a platform to explore themselves and their capabilities as LEADERS by directly putting them in challenging situations and offering them with life experiences'

Project NAMASTE 4.0 well justifies the above stated lines. In March, 2016 AIESEC in Ahmedabad & PDPU decided to host Internationals for the Summer Peak Cycle and then was the time to define 'WHY,WHAT & HOW' of the project. A TEAM had to be created, that will start from scratch and will go on to DEFINE the journey of all the stakeholders (Interns, University Students, NGOs, Clubs, AIESEC in Ahmedabad, Partners) associated with the project. TEAM Formation included:

- Launching Applications for Organizing Committee President (OCP) Role by the Executive Board Co-ordinator (EBC)
- 2. Interview Screening
- 3. Announcement of OCP
- 4. Launching Application for Organizing Committee Vice Presidents (OCVPs) by OCP as per her/his Application Structure
- 5. Interview Screening
- 6. Announcement of OCVPs
- 7. Launching Application for Organizing Committee (OC) Members.
- 8. Interviews
- 9. Announcement of OC


Once the OC VPs are recruited, the OCP plans an Induction for the Core Committee (CC = CCVPs + OCP) wherein the TEAM defines certain TEAM MINIMUMS (Team Name, Team Culture, Team Rules etc.) for themselves and then goes on to finalize the name and job description of their project as per the ideas mentioned by OCP in his/her Application. Once it's done, the OCP does portfolio specific expectation settings with the OCVPs and gives them a broader view of their Portfolio. Then starts the planning days wherein the CC develops on the Project idea, job role of interns, ideation of major events and most importantly the process of selecting the Interns who would define this project.




MATCHING PROCESS (SELECTING INTERNS)

It involves the following steps:

- 1. Putting up the project on AIESEC's online portal from where the interns around the globe get to know about the project timeline and job description.
- 2. Creation of Project Promotional Booklets, posters, leaflets etc.
- 3. Online Marketing of project on Facebook, Wechat etc.
- 4. Sending regular mails to interns and AIESECers from around the globe
- 5. Setting up of International Relations (IR) with other Local Committees (LCs) in the word for exchanges.
- 6. Getting leads through the above mentioned sources.
- 7. Interviewing them and explaining them the entire project concept.
- 8. Matching them on the AIESEC portal.
- 9. Providing Interns with the Invitation Letters (ILs) & TN-ANs (Trainee Nominee Acceptance Notes)
- 10. Keeping the matched interns engaged throughout the pre project phase through whatsapp/facebook groups, weekly newsletters, mails and skype calls.




WEEK 1

INTRODUCTION TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS (SDGs)


Date: 16th July, 2016



Date: 21st July, 2016



V. Ram Reddy, Ms. Rinkal Bagadia, Mrs. Leena Santosh and Dr. Anurag Kandya kindly agreed to be the faculty mentors for the several groups and guided us throughout the project. Intern group working towards Clean and Affodable Energy worked with Envirocrats Club of PDPU and completed the Case Studies based on Design of Biogas Plant for PDPU and Know Your Energy Campaign.

Date: 25th July, 2016




HOST FAMILY EXPERIENCE ON RAKSHABANDHAN
