
FUNDAMENTAL DUTIES – PART IV A – ART 51 A

- Swaran Singh Committee 1. duties 8 like paying tax, 2. penalty/punishment for non-compliance & 3. no court interference



Features of FDs

- 1. Moral & Civic
- 2. Reflection of Indian tradition
- 3. Only to citizens
- 4. Non-justiciable, No legal sanction
- 5. Parliament is free to enforce Criticisms
- 1. Not exhaustive casting vote
- 2. Vague, ambiguous, difficult to understand
- 3. Code of moral precepts only penalty NO
- 4. People will perform without its presence


